Re: Sensitech device acceptance

In late January, we announced Delta Cargo accepts certain Sensitech devices operating in the cargo hold. We are pleased to announce that effective immediately, additional devices have been approved for carriage on both Delta operated and NWA operated flights. Both Delta and NWA engineers have worked closely with Sensitech to determine these devices, vital to the healthcare industry, meet all requirements for operation in the cargo hold without interfering with the safety of the passengers, crew and aircraft. The approved devices fully satisfy the electromagnetic interference requirements defined in FAA Advisory Circular 91-21.1B. In addition, the Lithium content in these devices qualify for exceptions to the requirements provided by Special Provision 188 of § 172.102 (c)(1) of the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR; 49CFR Parts 171-180). At the present time the shipper **must** indicate on the Air Waybill in the handling information box all shipments containing active data loggers the manufacturer and model number of the data logging device. This information will enable Delta to accept such shipments in compliance with applicable FAA regulations. Shipments containing any unapproved active data loggers will be refused.
